LIBERATING TRADITION: Women's Identity and Vocation in Christian Perspective

"What does Scripture actually say about women, about gender, and about how we conduct our lives together? And how do we go about discovering, or uncovering or recovering, what Scripture says? If we rely on Sunday school and sermons, we probably hear about five or six women in the biblical texts - Eve, Sarah, Ruth, Esther, Mary the mother of Jesus, and Mary Magdalene - and we hear about how women are supposed to submit to their husbands and be quiet in church." (Kristina LaCelle-Peterson, 2008, p. 27, *Liberating Tradition*)

In this work, Kristina LaCelle-Peterson seeks to affirm the central place of Scripture in Christian life and highlight the liberating nature of the gospel for both men and women. She first considers the biblical ideal for human beings and then offers a biblical foundation for various topics, from identity and body image to language for God. She also examines the cultural nature of gender roles and the ways in which these roles have become entangled with ecclesial expectations.

Liberating Tradition offers a clear, Christian perspective on the issues that women face in the twenty-first century. The book does not provide a Christian gloss on the field of gender studies as it exists, but rather offers a gender-informed, scholarship-based, Christian platform from which to enter into dialogue with the scholars and scholarship that constitute that field.

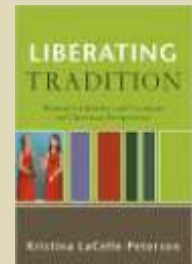

Kristina LaCelle-Peterson will be the honored guest speaker for the Division of Religion and Philosophy's Spring Colloquium. Dr. LaCelle-Peterson is an Associate Professor of Religion at Houghton College in Houghton, New York. She received her bachelor's degree from Houghton, her Master's in Divinity from Conwell Theological Seminary, and an MPhil and PhD from Drew University Graduate School.

Dr. LaCelle-Peterson joined the Religion and Philosophy Department in 2001 where she teaches courses in Bible, women's studies, theology, and educational ministry. Before working at Houghton College, she served as an Assistant Professor of Religion at Roberts Wesleyan University. Prior to that, she worked as an interim Senior Pastor at New Hope Free Methodist Church for two years.

Taking a look at her book, *Liberating Tradition: Women's Identity and Vocation from a Christian Perspective*, would be an excellent way to prepare for this lecture.
