

Our guest speaker for the 2010 Religion and Philosophy Colloquium is Dr. Stanley Hauerwas, the Gilbert T. Rowe Professor of Theological Ethics at Duke University Divinity School. Dr. Hauerwas has sought to recover the significance of the virtues for understanding the nature of the Christian life. His work cuts across disciplinary lines as he is in conversation with systematic theology, philosophical theology and ethics, political theory, as well as the philosophy of social science and medical ethics. He was named "America's Best Theologian" by Time magazine in 2001, and he delivered the prestigious Gifford Lectureship at the University of St. Andrews, Scotland, in 2001. Dr. Hauerwas also holds a joint appointment in the Law School at

Who should go on this trip?

College students that have a heart for working with youth and are ready to step outside their comfort zone by serving in a cross-cultural context.

What will we be doing there?

We will be serving at an English Camp for German teenagers. We need people to serve in specific roles during the duration of the camp – 1 Bible speaker (a manual is available with guidelines and helps to prepare 8 or 9 20 min. Lessons which are translated), 1 activities coordinator (a manual and guidelines are given to help prepare team activities for 2 hours for 9 days), 3-4 male camp counselors and 3-4 female camp counselors/small group leaders, 3-4 ESL teachers (material, guidelines and coaching will help with preparation), worship leaders (in addition to serving in another role), and 3-4 kitchen staff (a manual and menus will help with preparation). Regardless of your role, each member of the team will have the opportunity to show the love of Jesus in a real and practical way. By helping improve their English skills and building relationships through conversation, you will be able to share with them your walk with Jesus and make a positive impact in their lives.

Why do missions work in Germany?

"The Protestant state church is fairly dead. The percent of committed Christians in Germany is maybe at 3 or 4 percent. Eighty percent belong to a church nominally, Protestant or Catholic. A mere 0.5 percent belong to a free evangelical church." – from *Christianity Today*

Where in Germany are we going?

Teach Beyond (our partnering mission) offers camps throughout Germany and Switzerland (and is expanding their camp programs to other places in Europe and across the globe). We will be venturing to the very southwestern corner of the Black Forest, to the small town of Kandern, Germany. Kandern is located about 20 minutes from both France and Switzerland.

Do I need to know how to speak German?

No you do not need to know how to speak German. Some knowledge of German can be really helpful though. Teens come to camp with varying abilities of English language skills (some are almost fluent – some have just started learning).

How much will it cost? Estimated cost is \$2100
